1. INTRODUCTION

This Official Communication No. 1 (Registration) supports all National Federations which are interested in registering teams into one of the CEV Clubs competitions.

It contains important information and explanations about registration, regulations and other items for a smooth running of the competitions.

You will find a useful timeline / to-do-list in the Organization Guidelines - Chapter 1. Please read it carefully.

The CEV Office is available to help should you have any questions, or need any assistance during this process.

2. 2021 REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

Registration is done via the CEV database by completing the 01 form (one per gender), no later than:

Saturday 1st August 2020 at 23:59 CET.

Once you close the 01 form, the data is fixed and cannot be changed. The CEV will set the form as 'Accepted' once it is checked. Once the signed and stamped originals sent by mail are received, the CEV will set the form as 'Confirmed'.

More information about your registration is available in the <u>Organisation Guidelines - Chapters</u> 2 and 3.

For an explanation about the access to the CEV database and its functionalities, please check <u>Chapter 22.</u>

3. ALLOCATION OF SLOTS

The allocation of slots is in accordance with the CEV European Cups 2021 slots allocation.

Based on the CEV Board of Administration decision taken on 7 July 2020, notwithstanding article 31.1 §1 b) and §3 of the CEV Volleyball Competition Regulations and despite the relevant allocation of slots, the CEV will accept the registration of one more team per gender and per National Federation in the 1st-3rd Round of the CEV Champions League Volley 2021. In doing so, the respective club has to fulfil the following criteria, next to those set in the Regulatory Framework:

- a. At least two (2) participations in the CEV Champions League Volley from the last three (3) seasons (2018, 2019 and 2020).
- b. The club is ranked among the top five (1–5) according to the final standing of the respective National Championship. When reviewing applications from those teams not yet qualified for the CEV Champions League Volley, the CEV will process these according to their ranking position.

If there is a vacancy in the 4th round because a Club, being allocated a slot, does not apply or is denied registration, this vacancy will be filled by qualifying one more team from the 3rd round.



4. CEV REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

During your participation in a CEV competition, you will have to use and comply with the CEV Regulatory Framework, mainly with the <u>CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations</u>, the Organisation Guidelines and the Official Communications. These documents are available on the dedicated section of the CEV website.

You will also have to fill in CEV forms. These forms are available in your area in the CEV database.

For a full list of the CEV forms, please check the Organisation Guidelines - Chapter 3.

The CEV Board of Administration approved new changes in the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations, that can been seen here.

Please, be aware that by registering for the CEV Cups season 2020/2021 you acknowledge that you read and agreed on the terms of these Regulations and Official Communication.

5. 2021 CEV EUROPEAN CUPS CALENDAR

The 2021 European Cups calendar is currently available in your download area in the CEV Database and on the <u>CEV website</u>.

Based on the FIVB Board of Administration decision from May 2020, the last match of the national club championship shall be on 18 April 2021.

All European National Federations are requested to provide us their concrete National Leagues schedule to <u>clubs@cev.eu</u>. If a National Federation is requiring to finish their National Championship later than the 18 April 2020, an official request for approval has to be sent to the CEV. This request will be then discussed between the CEV and FIVB for potential approval.

6. 2021 CEV EUROPEAN CUPS RANKING

The CEV European Cups ranking lists for the CEV Champions League Volley and for the CEV Volleyball Cup / Challenge Cup are available on the <u>CEV website.</u>

According to the number of registered Clubs, the CEV will determine the number of levels of a CEV competition, the Clubs qualifying directly to a level and those required to play in a prior level.

The allocation of teams within the levels will be made via a seeding - in accordance with the CEV European Cups ranking list and the final standing of the National Championship (after any playoffs) - and a drawing of lots.

The allocation of the "visiting" and "hosting" Club status will be in align with the CEV Competitions Regulations, <u>Article 14.3.2</u>



8. CEV CHAMPIONS LEAGUE VOLLEY 2021

CEV CHAMPIONS LEAGUE VOLLEY 2021 - WOMEN

The 20 teams participating in the 4th Round will be divided into four sub-groups (I-II-III-IV) of five teams each before the Drawing of Lots as per the table below, which reflects the latest CEV Champions League Ranking and the number of teams per National Federation:

9. COVID-19 IMPACT

In response to the COVID-19 crisis, the CEV will respect and apply the decisions taken by the respective national and international authorities in regards to the safety measures and hygiene standards in place to protect the well-being and health of players, coaches, officials, media and fans.

If required by the respective authorities, matches without public will be approved. The CEV will adopt flexibility if due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the CEV Regulatory requirements clash with provisions applied by the respective authorities.

The CEV Office and the CEV Medical Commission are working on the CEV Competition Hygiene Guidelines in order to protect the health of athletes, coaches, fans, officials and everyone associated with our sport.

10. CONTINGENCY PLAN

In regards to the CEV Board of Administration decision taken on 7 July 2020, the following contingency plan has been approved:

For the 1st to 3rd Round of the CEV Champions League Volley 2021:

- a. To allow exceptionally due to proven COVID-10 imposed limitation to host both the home & away match by only one team
- b. If a team is prevented from hosting and traveling to a game due to COVID-19 based on a proven governmental decision, this is considered as a forfeit and the team will be relegated to the CEV Cup.

For the 4th Round of the CEV Champions League Volley 2021:

In case one or more teams in a pool are prevented from hosting or traveling to a game due to COVID-19 based on a proven governmental decision, the CEV will take a final decision in the scope of the following scenarios:

- a. To consider it as a forfeit and the concerned team will be eliminated from the Competition without any further financial and disciplinary sanction.
- b. To switch the format from home and away matches to tournament
- c. To establish a final pool ranking based on the played matches until the moment of this disruption to the initial schedule.

11. BANNED TEAMS

According to the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations, the below mentioned teams are not eligible to participate in the 2021 European Cups (non-exhaustive list):

12. DRAWING OF LOTS

The CEV European Cups Drawing of Lots will be held in Luxembourg in the second half of August. The exact date will be communicated in due course.

In order to provide the clubs with as much time as possible to plan their activities and matches during these uncertain times, this DOL includes also the 4th round of the CEV Champions League.

13. LED SYSTEM

Clubs wishing to use a dynamic advertisement system - LED system - shall submit the "LED system application form" to CEV for approval no later than four weeks before the first home match.

The LED system application form is available on CEV Cloud here. The application form has to be submitted as specified in the application document.

14. COMMERCIAL RIGHTS

In accordance with the rights already granted to Clubs (<u>Chapter 18 of the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations</u>), the table hereafter shows the split of Advertising spaces on the Playing area between the CEV and the organising clubs.

In case no CEV partner is contracted by 30th of September 2020 (date due to prior contractual commitments of CEV), 10% of the CEVs LED timing will be ceded to the clubs.

RESERVED PRODUCT CATEGORIES - CHAMPIONS LEAGUE VOLLEY, CEV CUP & CHALLENGE CUP:

Based on the CEV Board of Administration decision taken on 23/04/2020, only the following protected product categories are reserved by CEV for the upcoming competition:

- 1. Betting and Gambling services
- 2. Sports Equipment Volleyballs



*For the avoidance of doubt, although the "betting & gambling services" sector and/or category is reserved by CEV, the Organiser may exploit, based on prior agreement of CEV, the category for the "National lottery", provided that their sports betting operations are in no way presented under the same brand as their National lottery operations. Thus, gambling and betting services are prohibited and the category will not be released by CEV.

The CEV partner is the ultimate betting rights holder on a global basis in relation to the CEV Club Competitions including the CEV Champions League Volley, CEV Volleyball Cup and CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup.

15. BRANDING

For the upcoming season all branding materials and layouts will be made available after registration on the CEV Cloud and need to be implemented by all the clubs for the season 2020/2021.

Further information on all graphics will be published in the next Official Communication.

16. MEDIA RIGHTS & HOST BROADCAST PRODUCTION

CEV is the ultimate rights-holder of the CEV Club Competitions including the CEV Champions League Volley, CEV Volleyball Cup and CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup. The CEV has appointed the Sport Media Agency Infront as its global media rights distribution partner for the above mentioned competitions.

The following media rights exclusivity and broadcasting standards stated in the CEV Volleyball Competition Regulations will apply during the CEV Club competitions season 2020/2021:

CEV Champions League Volley 2021

Media Rights

The CEV Sport Media Agency Infront retains the exclusive worldwide media rights with respect to the Men & Women CEV Champions League Volley. As a result, the participating clubs <u>do not hold</u> any media rights within their domestic territory.

Host Broadcast Production

As announced by the European Recovery Program approved by the CEV BoA on 23.04.2020, for the CEV Champions League Volley season 2020/2021 all TV production obligation for the clubs is waived and the CEV to cover potential production costs beyond the Infront guarantee in case no host broadcaster is covering it.



In order to ensure a professional broadcast production, the participating clubs must provide upon request to CEV and its Sport Media Agency the following facilities and services on a <u>free of charge</u> basis:

- Camera platforms for one (1) or two (2) cameras centralized above the court and at the appropriate angle to produce a TV signal of international standard.
- A minimum number of commentary positions for each match to be located on the same side of the main camera and as close as possible to the playing field.
- Access to match data/statistics for the host broadcaster and the TV graphic operator.
- Adequate space in the TV and SNG compound for TV transmissions and production vans.
- One (1) fully furnished office for the CEV Sport Media Agency team on-site

CEV Volleyball Cup & CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup

Media Rights

With respect to domestic matches only, The CEV is granting to the participating clubs <u>the non-exclusive domestic media rights</u> in the territory.

Host Broadcast Production

The participating clubs shall respect and fulfill the requirements stated in the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations and summarized below:

For the avoidance of doubt, any domestic matches produced by the participating clubs during the CEV Volleyball Cup and CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup shall respect the following World Feed signal format and delivery requirements:

TV graphics	Provided by the CEV and its Sport Media Agency	

For the avoidance of doubt, the World Feed signal of each produced match must be delivered to CEV and its Sport Media Agency <u>free-of-charge</u> via satellite according to the following standards:

- Uplink to an established European satellite
- Book the corresponding satellite space (including the end-to-end test synopsis)
- Provide an encrypted satellite feed (also called BISS code)



In order to ensure a professional broadcast production, the participating clubs must provide upon request to CEV and its Sport Media Agency the following facilities and services <u>on a free of charge basis</u>:

- Camera platforms for one (1) or two (2) cameras centralized above the court and at the appropriate angle to produce a TV signal of international standard.
- A minimum number of commentary positions for each match to be located on the same side
 of the main camera and as close as possible to the playing field.
- Access to match data/statistics for the host broadcaster and the TV graphic operator.
- Adequate space in the TV and SNG compound for TV transmissions and production vans.
- One (1) fully furnished office for the CEV Sport Media Agency media and production team.
- Accommodation (full board) up to 2 rooms for the ČEV Sport Media Agency staff on-site provided that they are requested minimum 2 months before the start of each match.

Lastly, comprehensive TV production manuals and on-screen graphics package will also be distributed to each participating club and appointed host broadcasters.

17. DIGITAL COVERAGE

The rising of mobile phone users and social media changed the way we look at the sport of Volleyball including our engagement to that unique sport. There are many different social media platforms like Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and YouTube. Fans worldwide can use these social media platforms conveniently in their daily lives. Social media has also become an important tool for promoting events, distributing content, attracting new readers and creating more engagement to teams and athletes.

The participating clubs should use social media to promote CEV Clubs competitions. Here is below industry standards as well as social media tips that can be use throughout the season:

- Go "behind the scenes." Make fans who are not at the event feel like they are (and want to attend next time) by showing the scene on social media accounts. (e.g. show what the players are doing in their off time, before the game, etc.).
- Quote players: people love sharing a great quote. Make sure you use quotation marks and attribute it to the speaker.
- Think quality not quantity.
- Interaction between fans and athletes: when you post an interesting fact about a player, tag
 the athlete
- Cross-post to other media. Make posts by attaching photos and videos of the event.
- Interact with people at the event. Share newsworthy posts by fans and credible sports journalists.

Participating clubs are also expected to engage and support the CEV Digital & TV department with the following actions:

- o Promote the events via their own social media channels on a regular basis.
- o Use the official competition hashtags whenever posting about it.
- o Share on your social media behind the scene photos and video footage, showing the social side of players and staff, which can be re-tweeted or shared further on by the CEV.



- o Provide CEV with additional content to distribute on social media: the best promotion comes from the players themselves.
- o Produce additional video material, such as mixed zone interviews in English, for publishing across social media channels.
- o Engage with the CEV and other participating federations on social media by liking, sharing, reposting, following, retweeting content.

18. TEAMS & PLAYERS PICTURES

General Information

Team and athlete's pictures are used by the CEV for promotional purposes on its website, social media, TV graphics operations as well as to enhance the event experience for in-venue spectators with entertaining sport presentation concepts.

It is the responsibility of each participating club to provide to CEV quality pictures based on the following requirements.

Athlete portrait shot & staff

A **portrait shot** of each registered athlete and key staff shall be provided as per the standard below:



Quality standards:

- Background: neutral white only
- Eyes: facing the camera
- Expression: smiling
- Hands: behind the back
- Body position: straight to the camera with shoulder visible
- Match jersey: only from the current season (<u>no training suit, national team</u> jersey or polos are allowed)
- Jersey number: to be visible on picture
- Dimension: 1800*2800 pixel and 300 DPI minimum
- Maximum weight: 6-8 MB

Team picture

A team picture shall be provided as per the standard below:





Quality standards:

- Location: backdrop or on court.
- Background: neutral white only
- Eyes: facing the camera
- Expression: smiling
- Body position: straight to the camera
- Match jersey: only from the current season (no training suit or polos are allowed)
- Jersey number: to be visible on picture
- Team officials and head coach to wear smart dress code
- Fun team picture is also recommended (as a plus, to be delivered via CEV Cloud).
- Dimensions: at least 4000*2500 pixels and 300 DPI minimum
- Maximum weight: 12-15 MB


Delivery method:

1. Team Uniforms

When ordering the team uniforms, clubs must make sure they are produced according to the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations and CEV Organisation Guidelines for Clubs (see layout on following page).

The colour of uniforms required for each match will be communicated by the CEV via the 09 forms on the CEV Database.

COMPETITION Logo / Badge:

For the clubs playing the CEV Volleyball Cup and CEV Volleyball Challenge Cups 2021, the competition logo badge on the uniforms is not mandatory.







5. CEV Volleyball Cup - Prize Money Allocation

The CEV is well aware that travel restrictions, players tested positive to the novel coronavirus as well as other constraints resulting from the global health crisis have somehow pushed a number of teams to withdraw from the competition and / or declare a default for some or all of their matches. The CEV obviously understands the very difficult circumstances we all find ourselves in and the challenges faced by teams wishing to compete internationally even in such an environment. Therefore, the CEV has consistently applied and will continue to apply the decision taken by the CEV Board of Administration on April 23, 2020, whereby no financial or disciplinary sanctions are imposed on clubs withdrawing from the 2021 edition of the European Cups.

With this in mind and with reference to the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations, Art. 127.5, §1 'Participation fee,' we wish to inform you that any teams that have withdrawn from the competition before the start of the furthest level they had qualified to are not obliged to pay the relevant participation fees.

As far as prize money is concerned, teams competing in the CEV Volleyball Cup and CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup will receive the relevant amounts allocated for the actual matches they have played in the competition.
