

<u>Event Specific Hygiene Guidelines – CEV Snow Volleyball European Tour 2022</u> <u>Truskavets</u>

Health, safety and well-being of athletes, coaches, officials, staff and all persons involved is a top priority for CEV and the even Organiser!

This document provide specific information relating to the CEV Snow Volleyball European Tour 2022 Truskavets, and complement the <u>CEV Competitions Hygiene Guidelines</u>, the <u>CEV Hygiene</u> <u>Guidelines</u> - <u>Snow Volleyball Specifications</u> with specific, detailed implementation and amended protocols, which are in line with the respective requirements, measurers and recommendations applied by the Ukrainian National Authorities and CEV.

All participating team delegation members, CEV officials, match officials, LOC, staff, accredited media, international and local service providers, etc. adhere to fully comply and respect the protocols.

Failure to do so will be sanctioned with both financial and disciplinary sanctions according to the provisions of the CEV Snow Volleyball Competitions Regulations and CEV Disciplinary Regulations, and may lead up to withdrawal of accreditation and the right to participate in the tournament.

This is a dynamic document forming part of a tool for guidance. Throughout the pre-event, event and post-event phases, the following principles and concepts shall be applied and respected in the entire process, to minimize the risks of spreading coronavirus:

CEV and LOC retain the right to perform additional testing to any accredited person despite of already provided certificates throughout the period of the CEV Competition.



General Guidelines:

- Communication and education shall always be implemented towards the target groups to ensure the best performance of the tasks and identify the associated risks.
- Accurate and regular health screening before traveling, during the competition and after returning to the country of residence.
- All athletes, team delegation members, referees and CEV officials must have a printed certificate of COVID-19 fully vaccination issued by the relevant competent authorities, or a printed PCR test certificate of negativity to Coronavirus issued by authorised health laboratory no earlier than three days before arrival. Either document must be printed and in English.
- Anyone participating in the event (athletes, team delegation members, CEV officials, match officials, LOC, staff, accredited media, international and local service providers, etc.) should proactively and regularly check their health status. In case if you have any of the following symptoms such as; feel unwell, fatigue, cold symptoms, fever, coughing, severs shortness of breath, aches and pain, nasal congestion, runny nose, sore throat, loss of smell/taste, diarrhoea do not ravel or come to the Venue!
- Travelling athletes and accredited delegation members need to provide full and clear information about their travel schedule within the set timeline through the respective forms.
- Follow all hygiene precaution measures (wearing facemasks, regular hand washing, observing the rules of cough hygiene, social distancing protocol, etc.) at all time.
- Carefully review the Event Specific Hygiene Guidelines, CEV Competitions Hygiene Guidelines, CEV Hygiene Guidelines Snow Volleyball Specifications and provisions as communicated through the Practical Info.
- Carefully study the travel restrictions or other requirements set by the local authorities.
- Use the maximum personal attention and as much as possible, and isolate for the period between the COVID-19 PCR test (if needed) and before travelling to the competition.
- Ensure to use personal protection equipment for all international and local transportation.
- Follow the guidelines of the LOC staff and present all requested documents.
- Avoid gathering and crowding and stay within the areas of the hotel and Venue.
- Only one dedicated person per team delegation is required to attend at the Preliminary Inquiry, as per the schedule communicated at the later stage, and present all athletes passports, M-3 Player's Health Certificate, SV-01 form Player's Commitment, and a certificate of COVID-19 fully, or a COVID-19 PCR printed test result, issued no earlier than three days before arrival.
- Enter the venue through the dedicated entrance and stay within the venue dedicated areas.
- Do not socialize and stay in public areas after match or training.
- Disinfect hands and personal equipment when entering the venue, before and after each training/match.



- Athletes should arrive to the venue with official jerseys and personal equipment. No changing rooms or lockers will be provided.
- Do not share personal equipment or gear. Use individual tower and water bottle.
- Social distancing protocols organised and mandated throughout the event location(s) to optimise the safety and well-being of all groups.
- Limitation of the number of individuals on site to the minimum essential for the smooth conduct of the competition to allow for adequate distancing and entrance processing.
- Only accredited people can access specific areas, which will be controlled by the organiser.
- Keep the social distancing to other team delegations, officials and staff.
- Additional hygiene and sanitary precautionary measures prior to, during, and upon completion of the event.
- LOC will ensure the regular disinfection of all areas in the venue, and quantity of cleaning and disinfection materials.
- Collaborate with the CEV and the LOC in regular health screening.
- Any media initiatives will follow all precaution measure and will be communicated in detail to all athletes.
- Non-accredited persons will not be allowed to interaction with team delegation members.

Report immediately of any symptoms, even mild to the Hygiene Officer and collaborate with the LOC for the necessary actions!
